## Ohio to get \$8.4 million for Internet health initiative

Ohio has won four federal grants worth \$35.4 million to help improve health care in rural regions through fastest Internet connections.


The grants from the Federal Communications Commission represent the largest state share for any of the 42 states and two U.S. territories participating in the Telehealth initiative.

The networks will be built using the power of the Ohio Supercomputer Center.

Speedier computer connections will allow doctors and hospitals quicker access to medical records as well as diagnostic and treatment services now concentrated in the state's urban centers.
